




Numbers 2011 - 2014




- 28 conferences took place
- In the center of the conferences were the situation of 43 children and young people
- 235 persons from the social network took part of FGC
- The families made 284 decisions




Facts conferences 2011 bis 2013 und 2014

FGC 2014



- 16 co-ordinatars who has passed the training have got the license to coordinate conferences in Lower Austria
- Actually 14 coordinators are available
- Up to today there were 15 inquieries for FGC
 - 5 realized conferences
 - 6 conferences in initiation
 - 4 inquieries couldn't been realized





FGC - now is a normal assistance for people in Lower Austria in the youth welfare context

- Youth-welfare-offices have their own budget for FGC
- They have a certain list of coordniators to work with
- The fee for a co-ordinator:
- € 43,-- per hour, plus expences (travelling, comunication, trainings and supervision)
- Trainings for referrers are offered
- Professional help for referrers in organizing and passing a FGC
- Statistics of FGC in the context of the youth welfare system



Experiences





- Offering a FGC to a family is an intervention which has an effect
- Even when a FGC failed, there is also a visible effect → reflexion about why a conference didn't take place
- Suddenly people appear, which were unknown up to now
- Good experiences in training the refferers of a FGC

- Questions of time for the families, the co-ordinators and the referrers
- →arranging the date of the conference between families and referrers is sometime difficult because of labour legislation not possible on sunday!
- →huge numbers of participants
- →FGC not in the late evening
- Implementation of FGC sometimes takes to much time
- Referrers often don't think about FGC because of their huge workload
- → Talking about FGC as often as possible!









- Loadremoval for referrers through the co-ordinator
- Superior authorities are interested in FGC for economic reasons
- Co-ordinators must be aware of their role to coordinate
- → The referrers have to formulate their concerns by themselfs. This can't be the task of the co-ordinator



Germanspeaking-FGC-Networkmeeeting 2014 in St. Pölten



- Together with the University of Applied Sciences St. Pölten and the Provincial Government of Lower Austria we organized the Germanspeaking-FGC-Networkmeeting 2014 in St. Pölten
- As a part of the networkmeeting a sysmposium took place with a huge input of models of empowerment
